WashU was founded in 1853 and is located in St. Louis, Missouri, a 2-hour flight from New York City, a 4-hour flight from Los Angeles, or a short 40-minute flight from Chicago. St. Louis is a national hub for important research and business development, especially in the fields of biotechnology and plant science.
